








Japanese Studies Program

The Japanese Studies Program of Josai International University offers high quality education in Japanese culture and language. The core curriculum is a one-year intensive course based on the concept that study should be concise and to the point, easy to understand and interesting, for foreign students who wish to advance to university or graduate school, and for those who intend to master the Japanese language on a short-stay. For students who wish to enter a Japanese university or postgraduate programmes, special preparatory courses are offered to help students pass the N1 and N2 levels of Japanese Language Proficiency Tests, and to surpass 220 points of the Japanese as a Foreign Language section, and to obtain high scores on the Japan and the World section of the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students. The postgraduate preparatory course also provides ample instruction in basic thesis writing so as to better prepare those students wishing to continue their education at the graduate level. The programme also aims at fostering global sense to mainly foreign students who are from other Asian countries through language training and cultural studies in order to promote cultural exchanges. Students who have completed this course are well prepared to play an active role in the international community when returning to their home countries.




Special Course in Japanese Culture and Business Administration


This course is to furnish foreign students with language skills sufficient to understand lectures in the faculty and graduate schools. Through lectures mainly in Japanese, students improve their understanding of Japanese culture and business as well as Japanese language. In principle, students from abroad who have passed the N3 level of Japanese Proficiency Test take this course. This course provides not only language training, but also lectures on Introduction of Business Management and Information Science.

Special Course in Japanese Language

This course is designed to give foreign students the Japanese language skills necessary to handle academic work at university level. With the completion of one school year, students will achieve a high level of language ability in expression and understanding. In principle, students from abroad who have passed N5 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Tests take this course. Students who want to enroll on this course are required to study basic Japanese for 150 hours or more before application.

Advantages and Assistance

Adviser System

Full-time teaching staff act as advisers to foreign students. These experienced professionals are available to give students academic and other advice vital to making the experience at JIU a rich and rewarding one.

In addition to the full-time teaching staff who are dedicated to the Japanese Studies Programme, students have many opportunities to enjoy lectures given by staff from other JIU faculties. Students can thus experience a range of intellectual stimuli.

All lectures are given in Japanese. Foreign students are thus expected to master all aspects of the Japanese language in order to benefit from the courses they take.

Assistance in Finding Accommodation

JIU is located in the city of Togane, a picturesque, mediumsize city near one of the largest beaches in Chiba Prefecture. By university shuttle bus, Togane is just 30 minutes away from Narita International Airport. Many of these university shuttle buses link the major cities nearby including Tokyo and as far as Yokohama. Thanks to the special arrangements with local realtors and owners, international students pay on average 40,000 yen a month for a one bedroom apartment or 20,000 yen if a student wishes to share a two bedroom apartment.

Undergraduate Faculties

Faculty of Management and Information Sciences

Department of Management Science / Business Management Course

We are devoted to educate future practitioners and scientists who have general, in-depth and broad knowledge of health, medicine and welfare.



Educational Support

- · We encourage and offer academic support to students who enroll in related minors such as "Japanese Culture" or "Chinese Culture."
- The ISSC regularly organizes lectures and seminars that deepen student understanding of topics such as current affairs in the students' home country, Japanese society, and so on.
- The ISSC strongly promotes and supports enrollment in English and other courses leading to recognized certification.
- Through extra-curricular training and support, the ISSC aims for every international student to pass the N1 Japanese Proficiency Certification Test, or achieve an equivalent score on the Japan International-Student Exam

Supporting Student Life and Lifestyle in Japan

- The ISSC ensures that as many international students as possible receive support from government, private, JIU-funded and other scholarships. To encourage student participation in the education process, many of these scholarships are being awarded based on factors such as student grades, recognized certificates obtained, enrollment in related minors, improvement in Japanese proficiency, and active participation in a variety of universitybased projects.
- All people who rent an apartment in Japan are required to find a "guarantor" who will agree to assume financial responsibility in the case of non-payment of rent and so on. To eliminate this burden, JIU acts as guarantor for our international students.
- Many international students work as part-time assistants within various university offices. In addition to providing financial support while students study, the Work Study Programme (WSP) promotes greater student involvement in the university itself.
- With the cooperation of university offices or local businesses, we assist students to find part-time employment.

Supporting Campus Life

- During the school term, the ISSC staff and senior international students are available to talk with students who have concerns. We strive to identify and solve student problems as quickly as possible.
- The ISSC encourages active participation in a variety of projects and on-campus clubs, and promotes a variety of social activities aimed at helping international and Japanese university students achieve mutual understanding and develop lasting friendships.
- To encourage new friendships, deepen existing ones, and to allow students to share information about life in Japan, the ISSC organizes periodic gatherings for international students either within or across faculties, departments or graduate schools.
- The ISSC encourages students to participate in a variety of exchange activities organized by city hall and other local organizations. Through these local exchanges, students develop a deeper understanding of Japanese culture and society, which helps them adapt to life in Japan.
- The ISSC periodically organizes extra-curricular events aimed at making life in Japan meaningful and interesting for international students.

Career and Educational Guidance

- Students in or above their third year of study who have expressed a desire to continue their studies after graduating from JIU receive special counseling during seminars and from the ISSC to help determine the most appropriate course of continuing education to meet their needs.
- With the cooperation of university offices, the ISSC assesses student employment needs, offers suitable career information, and regularly arranges career-counseling sessions for international students. Moreover, with the cooperation of Japanese businesses located abroad and Japanese employment agencies, we are building an employment network to support students even after they return to their native countries.
- To further support student employment opportunities, we are currently building alumni networks of students who have graduated from JIU and returned to their home countries.
